Explanation of Effort and Availability of Commercial Equipment

NMU has removed Huawei equipment from 26 sites and continues removing covered customer premise equipment (CPE) devices ahead of the replacement of transmitter site equipment. The University has also placed equipment at six (6) additional sites but cannot remove Huawei equipment at those locations until technical concerns related to NMU's conversion from FDD to TDD transmissions can be addressed.

NMU has completed and received certification for its disposal work on 20 sites. Additional equipment removed from service is stored in a secure facility awaiting final disposal and certification.

NMU has completed the installation of equipment at 31 sites and continues to replace covered CPE devices on a regular basis.

Additionally, the University continues its regulatory, engineering, and bid work to complete multiple tower replacement projects in preparation for replacing covered equipment at the remaining sites.

We are finding that some equipment and services are commercially available, and some are not. We continue to experience delays with obtaining CPE devices that are ready to deploy. These CPE-related delays are delaying progress at several sites that are transitioning from FDD to TDD as the CPEs need to be replaced before we can remove and replace the RAN equipment.

Timeline Deviation: The lack of full program funding continues to prevent NMU from meeting its project timeline, as the University does not have the resources to purchase equipment and schedule removal, replacement, and disposal services at all of its sites. The partial funding allocated by the SCRP has caused NMU to establish a site replacement priority schedule, placing many sites on hold until full funding is approved. This phased project funding has led to delays in the timeline and will likely result in higher costs due to inflation and project management re-mobilization requirements should there be a lapse in construction activities.

Also contributing to replacement delays is the quantity of new towers and structural support modifications required for new equipment installation. NMU's unique geography and climate extremes, combined with the use of aging municipal water tanks and publicly owned elevated structures, resulted in a higher-than-expected number of failed structural analyses. To address this, NMU contracted with a local vendor familiar with wind and weather conditions unique to NMU's geographic service area to re-run those sites that had previously failed. This decision to reperform structural analyses while extending the replacement timeline did, however, result in the reclassification of ten facilities from "tower replacement" to "tower modification," providing a replacement path where none previously existed.

The timeline for new tower construction and existing facility modifications has been delayed by local climate, technical considerations, vendor availability, and the need for third-party involvement at sites not owned by NMU. However, due to harsh winter climate limitations in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, construction cannot begin until after the current RRD term deadline. The Upper Peninsula's unpredictable weather prevents establishing a precise replacement timeline as construction considerations - such as frozen ground, sub-zero temperatures, and vehicle road restrictions - restrict construction activities from November until April.

NMU has also experienced delays performing CPE swaps required by its switch from FDD to TDD due to device firmware issues and vendor supply chain delays. The University has been working closely with its vendor to resolve the concerns. CPE equipment swaps are required before selected tower site hardware changes can be made, adding to the time needed to complete this project. These issues related to CPE devices have prevented us from swapping the CPE devices on the network as quickly as we anticipated.

Due to these concerns, NMU anticipates that additional extensions will be required in order to complete the project as proposed.

NMU remains concerned that the lack of full SCRP funding will increase equipment and service prices for sites not yet scheduled for replacement. Without approval of full SCRP funding, it is likely that we will have to pause project-related activities in the upcoming months. Vendors have communicated to NMU that pausing its project activities due to the lack of full funding will likely result in personnel changes as they scale project activities to match the sites available for replacement. The remobilization of engineering, planning, and construction teams will add further delays to the project should replacements resume at a later date. In addition to increasing the overall project cost, this unanticipated replacement pause will make it difficult, if not impossible, for NMU to provide uninterrupted service to its existing customers, which could lead to approximately 2,000 customers losing broadband access across Michigan's Upper Peninsula.
