

How Should I Format My Handset Data?

Data Fields

Mobile wireless broadband providers are required to submit a list of at least three readily-available handsets challengers can use to conduct speed tests.

New! Final Handset Drive-test Compatibility Requirements:

As required by the [MF-II Handset Public Notice](#), filers must identify at least one handset that is either:

- (a) officially supported by the latest versions of industry-standard drive test software, such as JDSU, ZK-SAM, Rohde & Schwartz, or TEMS; or
- (b) engineering-capable and able to be unlocked and put into diagnostic mode to interface with drive test software.

In addition, filers must list at least one handset that runs the Android operating system. This handset can be the same as the one that meets requirements (a) or (b) above, but it need not be.


Filers may submit the list of handsets with their January 4, 2018 filings but are required to submit the list no later than thirty days following the publication of the [MF-II Handset Public Notice](#) in the Federal Register. We will announce the handset list filing deadline after the MF-II Handset Public Notice is published in the Federal Register.

The list of handsets must be submitted in an Excel Workbook with the following data fields. Sample data and an Excel template can be found at <https://www.fcc.gov/MF2-LTE-Collection>. Please enter your data in the Excel template for submission.
