Rules: A Roadmap

Ensure accuracy and completeness

- Only minor modifications are permitted
 - See Section 1.2105(b) for modification and dismissal of applications
- Certifications mandatory
- All applicants must include Exhibits A and D
- Some applicants must include additional Exhibits.
 - Exhibit B bidding agreements
 - Exhibit C bidding credits

No particular format for exhibits. Content is important.

Exhibit A: Applicant Identity and Ownership Information

 Applicants must disclose all "real parties in interest." Section 1.2112(a).

Section 1.2112(a) requires:

- List all parties having ten percent or greater interest in the applicant.
 - Name, address, and citizenship
- List all FCC-regulated entities of which the applicant or its owners own 10 percent or more.
 - Include a description of each entities' principal business and its relationship to the applicant

Exhibit A: Applicant Identity and Ownership Information

 Applicants seeking bidding credits must provide additional ownership information under Section 1.2112(b).

 Names, addresses, and citizenship of all officers, directors, and other controlling interests as defined by section 1.2110

Exhibit B: Joint Bidding Agreements

 Communications concerning bids, bidding strategies, and settlement agreements are generally prohibited among applicants for licenses in the same geographic area (section 1.2105(c)).

 Prohibition period is between the short-form deadline and the down payment deadline.

 For purposes of the anti-collusion rule, "applicant" includes controlling interests, ownership interests, and officers and directors.

Exhibit B: Joint Bidding Agreements

- In Exhibit B, applicants must identify all parties with whom they have entered into arrangements of any kind relating to the licenses being auctioned, including post-auction market structure. Section 1.2105(a)(2)(viii).
- Applicants that make or receive a prohibited communication of bids or bidding strategies must report, in writing, the communication immediately to the Commission.

Exhibit C: Status As a Small/Very Small Business

 Applicants may obtain a bidding credit based on their attributed average gross revenues for the last 3 years.

 Attributed gross revenues include revenues of the applicant, its affiliates, its controlling interests, and affiliates of its controlling interests.

Exhibit C: Status As a Small/Very Small Business

 Small Business: attributed average gross revenues < \$40 million
 – 15% bidding credit

 Very Small Business: attributed average gross revenues < \$15 million
 – 25% bidding credit

Exhibit D: Former Defaulter Certification

Required statement.

 Statement must indicate whether the applicant has ever been in default on any FCC license or any non-tax debt owed to any federal agency.

 The term "applicant" includes the applicant's affiliates, its controlling interests, and affiliates of its controlling interests.

Statement made under penalty of perjury.

Other Exhibits

 Exhibits E: "Designated Entities" includes small businesses

 Exhibit F: Applicants' opportunity to provide additional information

Waiver Requests: If filing, provide as much information as possible.

Reminders

 Applications will be available to the public.
 – Do not list taxpayer identification numbers (TINs) on the FCC Form 175

Carefully read all the FCC Form 175 certifications.

- Submission of the FCC Form 175 is a representation that its contents are true and correct.
- Submission of a false certification may result in penalties.
- Applicant must certify that it is legally, technically, financially, and otherwise qualified to participate in the auction.
